

We get lots of inquiries concerning the General Plan of the City of Los Angeles. The General Plan in Los Angeles is called the Framework Element. It is the strategy for long term growth and acts as a guide to update the Community Plans and Citywide Elements of the General Plan. To learn about City Planning:




The drop down menu offers several choices. We wanted to look at the Framework Element so we clicked on it.




The first place to start is the Executive Summary. This gives the reader a good basic understanding of what a general plan is, why it is necessary, how it relates to State requirements and why Land use must be compatible with the other City Elements.


For a further, deeper understanding of the whole process click on Contents which opens up the whole world of Planning.



For more information click on the Framework Final EIR (Final Environmental Impact Report). This is the document that had to be approved by the City Council and signed by the Mayor in order for the Framework Element to become our new General Plan.




All discretionary projects quote the Community Plan. In the Miracle Mile that is the Wilshire Community Plan. Going back to the GENERAL PLAN tab on the left, click on Community plans.




Then click on the 35 Community Plans, which brings up the map of Los Angeles broken down into community plan area's. Find the plan named Wilshire and click on it.





There is lots to explore but I usually suggest clicking on the Community Plan tab which brings up the document which governs all development in the Miracle Mile.



After that there is a tremendous amount of information about our area that can be found by clicking on the rest of the buttons. Happy reading.
